
The little church with a BIG heart

would be a great time as you prepare for the beginning of this exciting journey!




As we greet the rhythms of fall, I hope we will see you soon for these and many other opportunities for life, service, and worship with Geneva Presbyterian!


Fall

It may not yet be visible, but Geneva is making good progress on the acquisition of a new entrance LED sign. An LED sign is a modern means of communicating our messages using Light Emitting Diodes (LEDs). Local LED signs include Ivymount School, Potomac Community Center on Falls Road, Westfield Mall entrance and most public schools.

A new sign will be welcoming and informational. LED signs are fully programmable by Geneva Staff to change the messaging as often as they choose. That way, the sign can promote the Day School as well as the Church and our missions. Seven Locks Road gives us traffic exposure of about 10,000 cars a day. Even if just 1% responded to our promotional messaging, we'd have over 100 new visitors or Day School parents. People who've never heard of Geneva or knew that we were here will now learn about us.

Church fundraising for the sign has been strong. The GDS board has agreed to move forward. We're currently finalizing the contracts with the sign company and the electrician. Then we start the permitting process. This can be simple or complex in Montgomery County. We'll see how this goes. After the permit is awarded, we run a new power line under the driveway to the new sign location, remove the old signs and install the new one.

I am writing these treasurer's comments just after finishing my treasurer's report to our Session. As I reported, as of July 31 we are 11/12 of the way through our fiscal year, or 91.67%. And, although we still have 1 more month of activity before we finish our fiscal year, there is good news: we are ahead of budget by \$276,017.50.

How did this happen, you ask? Well, it's a combination of 3 things: (1) total church income is at 172.59% of budget - we projected YTD income at \$277,016.68, and actual YTD income is actually \$521,560.19; (2) Geneva Day School gave us a generous donation of \$200,000, included in the above amount; and (3) total expenses are at 86.29% - we projected YTD expenses to be \$537,011.32, and actual YTD expenses are actually only \$505,537.33.

So, we have taken in more income than expected, and we spent less money than expected. Unless something *very* unusual occurs in August, I think we will be in good shape for the year-end. I will report on year-end numbers when we have our annual congregational meeting.

If our fiscal year ends on August 31, how does that affect pledged and unpledged giving? Well, I (and almost all of us) think of our personal budgets on a calendar year basis – January 1 through December 31. That's only natural, as we use the same calendar year when we file our taxes. And of course, charitable donations – including what we give to Geneva – are a tax deduction.

So, I personally decide each year what my donations will be, and I give accordingly, without regard to fiscal or calendar years. Although we will have a Stewardship campaign this fall, that is really a way for our congregation to give some thought to what we will decide to give; it's also a way for the Executive Committee to get a sense of what we might expect to receive for the upcoming year.

In other words, don't worry too much about fiscal vs calendar year giving from a Geneva perspective – we will gratefully accept your contributions, no matter when!

Your Executive Committee is hard at work developing our budget for next year (9/1/2023 – 8/31/2024). That budget will be presented to Session for their approval, and then presented to you at our annual congregational meeting. Until then, please let me know if you have *any* questions and I will be happy to answer and explain.
